COURSE: ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

GRADE LEVEL: KINDERGARTEN

- 6. relate personal experiences to others.
- 7. use personal pronouns for nouns.
- 8. respond to WH questions.
- 9. expand a question to three words with a teacher model.
- 10. perform a three-step task according to teacher direction.
- 11. incorporate "when" and "where" words in original language.

- 12. demonstrate and understanding of past, present and future by using "yesterday", "today", and "tomorrow".
- 13. fingerspell first and last name.
- 14. retell events from experience stories.
- 15. use location words (i.e., over, under, in, on, behind)
- 16. identify 200 vocabulary pictures.
- 17. dictate captions to correspond to pictures of an unfamiliar story.
